



CODE ENFORCEMENT

The following is a summary of my activities for July 2012. During the month of July the Borough received one hundred and twelve (112) complaints relating to code enforcement and borough ordinances.

Of these:

- 49 were for garbage collection
- 7 were for accumulation of rubbish
- 20 were for miscellaneous
- 2 were for animals/rodents & pest
- 1 was for protected treatment
- 1 was for tree problems
- 14 were for high grass & weeds
- 3 were for no building permit
- 1 was steps and handrails
- 2 were for abandon vehicle
- 2 were for illegal parking pad
- 3 were for street & pothole problem
- 1 was for unsafe structure
- 5 were for sidewalks and driveways
- 1 was a sewer problem

Of the above mentioned cases:
Sixty-five (65) are active
Forty-seven (47) are resolved

Permit Activities

The following is a summary of the permit activities for the Borough for July 2012. The Borough issued one hundred-fifteen (115) licenses / permits relating to building / zoning for July 2012:

Of these:

- 20 were for building permits
- 16 were for transfer of deeds
- 14 were for dye checks
- 1 was for HVAC permit
- 6 were for occupancy permits
- 41 were for PA1 calls
- 4 were for roof permits
- 3 were for sign permit
- 10 were street & sidewalk opening permits

The total estimated cost of permit related work was \$153,719.71. Per that amount the Borough collected \$4,159.00 in permit fees.
