

1. COUNCIL ACTION REQUESTED

a. REBID 2016 STREET & ALLEY RECONSTRUCTION & RESURFACING PROJECTS

- i. CONTRACT A – Street Reconstruction & Resurfacing Contract
Bids were received on May 25, 2016. Recommend award to lowest responsible bidder. See my May 27, 2016 Recommendation of Award memo.
- ii. CONTRACT B - Alley Resurfacing Contract
Bids were received on May 25, 2016. Recommend award to lowest responsible bidder. See my May 27, 2016 Recommendation of Award memo.

2. ENGINEERING IN PROGRESS

b. REBID 2016 STREET & ALLEY RECONSTRUCTION & RESURFACING PROJECTS

- i. CONTRACT A – Street Reconstruction & Resurfacing Contract
Bids were received on May 25, 2016. Recommend award to lowest responsible bidder.
- ii. CONTRACT B - Alley Resurfacing Contract
Bids were received on May 25, 2016. Recommend award to lowest responsible bidder.

c. 2016 POTOMAC AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION

Renderings were presented at the April council meeting showing 3 alternatives for construction. Alignment #2, the composite reducing the

number of parking spaces by 7, was approved at the June 6th meeting. Final design is proceeding.

Utility replacement, beginning with the water main, began on May 1, 2016. As of this date the water main is completely installed from W. Liberty Ave. to Broadway Ave. Final connection is still required in W. Liberty Ave. The date for the transfer has not be set yet by the water company. Transfer of water services is ongoing and anticipated to take 3-weeks in the project area.

Commencement of the gas main installation is anticipated to begin the week of July 5th.

- d. **2016 Sanitary Sewer O&M Project**
CCTV data, obtained from the 2015 O&M Contract, has been forwarded to the borough GIS maintainer to update the database. Once updated, the sewers to be televised in 2016 will be determined. Subsequently, a CCTV O&M contract will be put out to bid.
 - e. **ALCOSAN Sewer Regionalization Implementation**
On August 27, 2015 the Borough Manager and Engineer met with representatives from ALCOSAN to identify sewers for transfer. On September 30, 2015 all available CCTV data and reports for the subject sewers, were uploaded to the ALCOSAN FTP site. The Borough is awaiting any future correspondence as to whether additional information is required.
 - f. **MS4 TMDL Strategy Plan**
The updated TMDL Strategy Plan was hand delivered to the PaDEP on December 30, 2015.

2. Neither the Artist nor Agent shall be responsible for non-performance of Artist due to accidents, riots, strikes, sickness, Acts of God, death, inclement weather, family or employment obligations, or any other reason beyond Artist's or Agent's control. However, if possible with your approval we will endeavor to furnish a substitute at the same terms and conditions as stated on the face of this contract. If unable to furnish a substitute with your approval liability will be limited to refund of deposit.
3. Deposit is not refundable for postponement or cancellation for any reason other than those stated above.
4. Artist shall be considered an independent contractor and not an employee and/or agent of Agent. As an independent contractor, Artist shall be responsible for Artists own federal, state, and local withholding taxes, Workman's Compensation and Social Security contribution, Self Employment taxes, Insurance and any and all other taxes and obligations.
5. Allowing Artist to work is construed as acceptance of the terms of this contract even if not signed by both Purchaser and Artist.

**Motion to Advertise Ordinance #1616, Amending the Borough

**OFFICIAL
BOROUGH OF DORMONT
ORDINANCE NO. 1616**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF DORMONT,
ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING
THE BOROUGH OF DORMONT CODE OF ORDINANCES,
ANIMALS, TO PERMIT AND REGULATE THE KEEPING
OF CHICKENS AND FLIGHTLESS DUCKS WITHIN THE
BOROUGH.**

WHEREAS, Section 1202(10) of the Pennsylvania Borough Code, 53 P.S. §1202(10) authorizes the Borough of Dormont (the “Borough”) to regulate the keeping of livestock, fowls and all other animals within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Dormont desires to amend the Dormont Borough Code of Ordinances, Animals, as amended, to permit and regulate the chickens and flightless ducks within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Dormont is committed to creating policies that encourage environmental stewardship and sustainability.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the Borough of Dormont hereby ordains and enacts as follows, incorporating the above recitals by reference:

SECTION 1

Chickens and Flightless Ducks

A. Chickens and Flightless Ducks Permitted; Roosters Prohibited.

- i. No residence shall contain at any one time more than four hens over the age of 1 month.
- ii. In the case of two-family dwellings, conversion dwellings, or multi-family dwellings without individually owned backyards, the maximum number of hens allowed is four per property.
- iii. Chickens and flightless ducks shall be permitted only in the R-1, R-2 and R-3 zoning districts.
- iii. No person shall keep or harbor any rooster within the Borough.

B. Definitions.

Chicken Run: An enclosed area in which chickens and/or flightless ducks are allowed to walk and run about.

Coop: a small building for housing poultry.

C. Permits.

- i. No person may own, keep, or harbor any chickens within the Borough without first obtaining a permit from the Borough Zoning Officer. An application for a permit shall be made in writing and on such forms or in such format as established by the Borough, and shall be accompanied by the prescribed permit fee in the amount established from time to time by resolution of Borough Council.
- ii. No person shall erect, alter, relocate, or expand a coop without first obtaining a zoning permit from the Borough Zoning Officer. The issuance of a zoning permit shall not obviate the necessity for compliance with all other Borough Ordinances, including, but not limited to, Chapter of the Dormont Borough Code of Ordinances, “Zoning”, or, if applicable, Chapter of the Dormont Borough Code of Ordinances, “Code Enforcement”. Non-property owners that wish to keep chickens on property that the non-property owner is renting must include written permission from the property owner or landlord that explicitly indicates that the non-property owner has permission to own chickens on the subject property. Such written permission shall be supplied to the Borough as part of the annual chicken permit application.

D. Coops. All chickens must be kept in a coop, chicken run, or fenced area at all times.

During daylight hours, chickens may have access to outdoors via a chicken run.

Chickens may also be allowed in a securely fenced yard if supervised so that they cannot stray beyond the premises on which they are secured. The chickens shall be secured within the coop during non-daylight hours.

- i. Coops and chicken runs shall be located at least 25 feet away from a doorway, opening or window of an occupied dwelling other than that of the property owner.

- ii. The minimum coop shall be solid, vermin and predator proof and shall provide at least three (3) square feet of area per chicken.
 - iii. The chicken run shall be adequately fenced to contain the chickens on the property and to prevent predators from gaining access to the chicken run.
 - iv. Coops shall be enclosed on all sides, and shall have a roof and doors. Access doors must be able to be shut and locked at night. Openings, windows, and vents must be covered with vermin, predator and bird-proof wire of one-half (1/2) inch hardware cloth.
 - v. Materials used for making a coop shall be uniform for each element of the enclosure such that the walls are made of the same material, the roof has the same shingles or other covering, and any windows or opening are constructed using the same materials. The use of scrap, waste board, or similar material is prohibited.
 - vi. The coop shall be painted or stained; the color shall be uniform around the coop and shall be in harmony with the surrounding area.
 - vii. Coops and chicken runs shall be designed to provide safe and healthy living conditions for the chickens and shall provide shade in the warm weather, suitable protection from inclement weather, and adequate ventilation.
 - viii. Coops and chicken runs shall be kept in good repair and must be capable of being maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, free of vermin and obnoxious odors.
 - ix Coops and chicken runs must reasonably prevent the chickens from running at large. Chickens will be considered running at large within the meaning of this Section when off the permit holder's premises.
 - x. Coops and chicken runs shall be open at all times for inspection by the Borough.
- E. Feed and Water.** Chickens shall be provided with access to feed and clean water at all times. All feed, water, and other such items associated with the keeping of chickens shall be properly stored in a clean and sanitary manner so as to prevent the infestation of rats, mice, or other rodents or vectors.

F. Nuisance. No person shall keep or harbor chickens in the Borough in a manner that creates an offensive odor, excessive noise, or unsanitary conditions which disturb neighboring residences or threatens public health. Chickens running at large shall be considered a public nuisance.

G. Veterinary Care. Owner shall provide veterinary care if chickens and/or flightless ducks are known or suspected to be sick or injured.

H. Slaughtering. No person shall slaughter or butcher any chicken within the Borough.

I. Composting. It shall be unlawful for any person to spread or cause to be spread or deposited upon any ground or premises within the Borough any chicken manure. However, chicken manure may be composted on the property where the chickens are housed and the composted material then applied to gardens or yards.

K. Sale of Chicken Parts or Eggs. Any sale of chicken parts or eggs must comply with state and federal laws and regulations.

Section Two: Authority of Council to amend, modify or repeal.

The Borough reserves the right at any time, by ordinance, to amend or otherwise modify or repeal this Ordinance.

Section Three: Repeal

Any ordinance or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section Four: Severance

Should any sentence, section, clause, part or provisions of this Ordinance amendment be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part declared to be invalid.

Section Ten: Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Dormont is specifically vested with the power to make such regulations as may be necessary for the health, safety, morals, general welfare and cleanliness and the beauty, convenience, comfort and safety of the Borough in accordance with Borough Code Section 1202(6) 8 P.S. § 1202(6); and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council is specifically vested with the power to provide, improve, maintain and regulate public parks, parkways and playgrounds, playfields, and other recreation places (hereinafter collectively “Parks”) in accordance with Borough Code Section 2701 8 P.S. § 2701; and

WHEREAS, the Borough’s Parks are intended for the healthy enjoyment of all residents, including children and youth; and

WHEREAS, the litter and second hand smoke associated with smoking and tobacco use in the Parks can pose health risks to the residents of the Borough.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by Borough Council of the

Borough of Dormont, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania and it is hereby ordained and enacted by and with the authority of the same.

SECTION 1. Chapter 150 shall be amended to add:

Section 150-5: Smoking Prohibited in the Parks of the Borough

The carrying of any kind of lighted pipe, cigar, cigarette, electronic cigarette or any other lighted smoking equipment and any other use of tobacco products is strictly prohibited in the Borough of Dormont Public Parks and Recreational Areas.

SECTION 2. That any Ordinance or part of any Ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 3. Should any part or section of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof other than the part held to be invalid.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately.

§ 1001. Organization of council, quorum, participation by telecommunication device, voting, compensation and eligibility.

(a) Organization.--The council shall organize on the first Monday of January of each even-numbered year by electing one member as president and one member as vice president, who shall hold the offices at the pleasure of the council. If the first Monday is a legal holiday, the meeting and organization shall take place the following day. Any action taken by any council at any time between 12:01 a.m. on January 1 of an even-numbered year and the organization of council in that year shall be subject to reconsideration by the new council at any time within ten days after organization. The council may, at the organizational meeting, appoint other officers as may be provided for by law or ordinance, or as may be deemed necessary for the conduct of affairs of the borough, and may transact any other business as may

come before the meeting. The president, and, during the president's absence or incapacity, the vice president, shall preside over the meetings of council and perform other duties as are prescribed by this part or by ordinance.

(b) Quorum.--A majority of the membership of council then in office shall constitute a quorum. Except as provided in subsection (c), only council members physically present at a meeting place within the borough shall be counted in establishing a quorum.

(c) Telecommunication.--Council may provide for the participation of council members in council meetings by means of telecommunication devices, such as telephones or computer terminals, which permit, at a minimum, audio communication between locations, if the following apply:

(1) A majority of the membership of council then in office is physically present at the advertised meeting place within the borough and a quorum is established at the convening or reconvening of the meeting. If, after the convening or reconvening of a meeting, a member has been disqualified from voting as a matter of law, but is still physically present, council members participating by telecommunication device in accordance with this section shall be counted to maintain a quorum.

(2) The telecommunication device used permits the member or members of council not physically present at the meeting to:

(i) speak to and hear the comments and votes, if any, of the members of council who are physically present, as well as other members of council who may not be physically present and are also using a telecommunication device to participate in the meeting; and

(ii) speak to and hear the comments of the public who are physically present at the meeting.

(3) The telecommunication device used permits the members of council and the members of the public who are physically present at the meeting to speak to and hear the comments and the vote, if any, of the member or members of council who are not physically present at the meeting.

(4) Physical absence of a council member. Council may only authorize participation by telecommunication device for one or more of the following reasons:

(i) illness or disability of the member of council;
(ii) care for the ill or newborn in the member's immediate family;
(iii) emergency; and
(iv) family or business travel.

(5) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to limit the protections and prohibitions contained in any law or regulation relating to the rights of the disabled.

(d) Voting.--A member of the council shall not be disqualified from voting on any issue before the council solely because the member has previously expressed an opinion on the issue in either an official or unofficial capacity.

(e) Compensation.--Members of council may receive compensation to be fixed by ordinance as follows:

(1) In boroughs with a population of less than 5,000, a maximum of \$1,875 per year.

(2) In boroughs with a population of 5,000 or more but less than 10,000, a maximum of \$2,500 per year.

(3) In boroughs with a population of 10,000 or more but less than 15,000, a maximum of \$3,250 per year.

(4) In boroughs with a population of 15,000 or more but less than 25,000, a maximum of \$4,125 per year.

(5) In boroughs with a population of 25,000 or more but

less than 35,000, a maximum of \$4,375 per year.

(6) In boroughs with a population of 35,000 or more, a maximum of \$5,000 per year.

The salaries shall be payable monthly or quarterly for the duties imposed by this part. Benefits provided to members of council under section 1202(26) (relating to specific powers) shall not be considered pay, salary or compensation, but payment for all or a part of the premiums or charges for the benefits shall be in accordance with section 1202(26). Any change in salary, compensation or emoluments of the elected office shall become effective at the beginning of the next term of the member of council.

(f) Eligibility for compensation.--The population shall be determined by the latest available official census figures. In no case shall the compensation for any member of council exceed that of the mayor in any given borough, but, if the mayor's compensation exceeds that authorized by this section for members of council, the president of council may receive compensation not to exceed that of the office of mayor.



Our review of the bids indicates that all totals are mathematically correct and do contain all required documentation properly executed in accordance with the requirements of the bid specifications except as follows:

- A. Merante Contracting, Inc. made summation errors in the tabulation of the Base Bid and Alternate #1. The results indicated above reflect the corrected totals.

The Engineer's Estimate for this project was approximately \$62,500 for the base bid and Alternates #A & B. The bid of the apparent low bidder, Mele & Mele & Sons, Inc., at \$53,605.50 is below the engineer's estimate, but more importantly, approximately \$14,000 less than the original bid. The bid from the other bidder was significantly higher on each item respectively.

The Borough is familiar with the work of the low bidder Mele & Mele & Sons, Inc. They are currently in the Borough resurfacing Oklahoma and Tennessee Avenues, and reconstructing Delwood Avenue.

In accordance with the specifications, as funding allows, council may award based upon any combination of the base bid with the various alternates added. Based upon the value of the bid for each item, considering the savings from the original bid, I would recommend award to Mele & Mele & Sons, Inc., who is the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, for the base bid and any combination of the alternates as funding allows.
