DEAR DORMONT RESIDENTS, BUSINESS OWNERS AND VISITORS,

Thank you for reading the Spring Time edition of the Dormont Newsletter.

As a very cold winter is winding its way to a finish, and the promise of Spring is upon us, I want to let you know about a positive for our 2013 Budget that just ended. Council has implemented a policy of maintaining reserves of \$1 million to help us weather any catastrophe that the Borough might face. In 2013 we were able to exceed that amount. That meant that in 2014, we were, for the first time in many years, able to not take a Tax Anticipation Note and pay interest on that note. That saved the Borough over \$10,000. Now a little about some of the bigger things going on in 2014 here in Dormont.

First we will be finishing up our Comprehensive Plan and moving right into rewriting our Zoning Code. For anyone who has a business and can't put up the type of sign they would like or for a homeowner who can't put a parking pad on their property or for the resident who sees certain businesses proliferating in the Borough, rewriting our Zoning Code will address these concerns. This is a lengthy process that will involve at least five public hearings. Your participation in this process will ensure that the final product is the best we can develop.

Second is the Transit Oriented Development (TOD) we are bringing to West Liberty Avenue adjacent to the Dormont Junction T-Stop. We are currently negotiating long-term lease with a developer, Fore Properties, and will soon begin the process of nego-

tiating the design and physical attributes of the project. We do know that this will be a mixed-use multi-family development with apartments over commercial/retail space on West Liberty. We also know that there will be significant parking for the Borough. The Fore proposal includes 100 spaces for the Borough's use. There will be multiple public hearings on this project as well once the development designs start being submitted.

Finally there are some of our capital projects such as our Road Program where we will again spend \$500,000 to improve roads and this year, a significant portion of that money will go towards improving our worst alleys. The list of alleys being improved will be available on our website sometime in March. We also have our Sewer Repairs Program where we will again be spending \$500,000 to maintain sewer lines, manholes in our sanitary sewer system. And while not yet a budgeted capital project, we are now beginning to have a conversation about storm water improvements. The Council President's Ad Hoc Committee on this issue is meeting to determine how we address the various flooding and other storm water issues in the Borough. Perhaps you have flooding after a rainstorm. Or perhaps you notice storm water inlets that are unable to handle a heavy rain. These are areas that will be addressed by the Committee along with the coming Federal regulations about cleaning our storm water of pollutants.

There are many other activities coming during 2014. Please take a moment to let us know how we are doing. You can even use Dormont Delivers on our website at www.boro.dormont.pa.us or on your smart phone for that. And until next time, enjoy your Spring.



OUR STORM WATER PROBLEMS

Did you know that:

- well over 80% of the rain that falls on Dormont does not soak into the soil but runs off into our storm water sewer system;
- we own a storm sewer system made up of 577 inlets and almost 12 miles of storm water pipe but we only know the size and condition of about one-half of that;
- almost anything that you throw in the street or apply to your lawn ends up in the Ohio River;
- our sanitary sewer system and the storm sewer system are two different systems;
- all of our runoff flows into Saw Mill Run and then into the Ohio River;
- storm water is not treated in any way from its journey from Dormont to the Ohio River;
- we put over 90 Tons of sediment into Saw Mill Run per year;
- we are under orders from EPA to achieve a total reduction of 73% of sediment and 95% of nutrients that we contributes to the Ohio River;
- there are homes in Dormont that have incurred severe flooding damage due to storm water runoff and an antiquated storm water sewer system and;
- to study these problems and develop possible solutions, I have appointed a committee of residents. Committee members include: Ernie Ceraso, Latonia Ave; Trebor Evans, McNeilly Ave; Leah Petrilli, Voekel Ave; Valorie Sherman, Illinois Ave; Anne Stock, Broadway Ave; Frank Stumpo, Belrose Ave; and Terry Williams, New Haven Avenue. You will be hearing more from them throughout 2014.

What People Should Know

Building Permits

Spring is here and it is the time of the year you might be preparing to do some projects around your home. The building department is here to help you on any project you might have in mind. Please don't hesitate to call with your ideas, we are more than happy to help you with any project you have.

We would like to take this opportunity to explain some of the borough's regulations as they pertain to building permits.

Submitting an Application - Most projects require that the following items be submitted along with the completed application.

- 1. Construction documents** which include (a) a description of the proposed activity, (b) drawings and/or illustrations and (c) a list of materials being used.
- 2. Plot plan** drawn to scale on a property survey, which is current and sealed by a licensed land surveyor who is registered by the Commonwealth.
- 3. Proof of Workers Compensation Coverage**
All applications are subject to a ninety - (30) day review period, in order to ensure compliance with applicable codes and ordinances. However, most applications allow for a shorter review period.

WORK THAT REQUIRES A PERMIT

1. All New Construction

2. Interior Renovations

- Changing dimensions or removing of any existing window or door
- Opening of any new window or door
- Construction or reconstruction of any wall or staircase
- Removal or relocation of any existing wall or staircase
- Any plumbing activities (permit issued by Allegheny County)
- All electrical work requires an inspection by an approved agency

3. Exterior Renovations

- Additions to existing structures
- Porch enclosures
- Public and Private sidewalks
- Private driveways and parking areas
- Porch, patio and/or stairway construction and reconstruction
- Construction or reconstruction of any wall
- Replacement of over 25% of roof
- Installation of permanent awnings
- Erection or replacement of fencing
- Installation of swimming pools & hot tubs with a depth greater than 18 inches

Remember to call twenty-four hours in advance to schedule any required inspections.

We strongly suggest that you call the borough office at 412-561-8900 x232 **BEFORE** you begin any project. The staff will be delighted to further explain the regulations as they pertain to building permits.

Household Trash: Proper Storage Between Collection Times

The Borough of Dormont Code requires each owner and occupant of a property to provide a sufficient number of containers for the storage and disposal of trash between times of collection service. Improper storage of household trash can provide a source of food and a home for rodents and insects and may result in a health nuisance. The following steps must be taken to prevent the harborage of rodents and insects on a property and to protect the public health of a community.

The owners and occupants of a property are responsible for ensuring the following requirements are met until trash collection service occurs:

- 1. Approved Garbage Containers:** A durable, leak-proof container with a tight fitting lid is an approved container for the storage and disposal of trash and garbage between times of trash collection service. The owner and occupant of a property are responsible for providing a sufficient number of garbage containers with lids for the proper storage and disposal of household trash. **Containers must be sealed or covered at all times.**
- 2. Size/Quantity:** Garbage containers must be sufficient in size and must be provided in adequate numbers to prevent overflow of household trash between times of trash collection service.
- 3. Use of Plastic Trash Bags:** Plastic trash bags are subject to breakage by birds, dogs, cats and rodents. Plastic bags alone are not approved for the storage and disposal of household trash. A leak-proof plastic bag used in combination with approved containers is the recommended method for the storage of household trash.
- 4. Storing Garbage Containers:** With the exception of pickup days when the containers are placed out for collection, the containers shall be properly stored on the owners or occupants premises at all times. If a property owner or tenant fails to comply, the Borough of Dormont may issue a warning, notice of violation or citation. Failure to comply with the proper storage and disposal of household trash constitutes a violation of the International Property Maintenance Code. Please follow these codes to maintain a safer community and keep Dormont beautiful.

Signs have been posted on all streets regarding their street sweeping day. *If your regularly scheduled sweeping day is a holiday, 4th of July or Labor Day, your street will not be swept that month: Potomac Avenue business district, West Liberty Avenue and the Pool parking lot will be done daily throughout the week, once per month.*

LEAF COLLECTION DATES FOR SPRING: We will have two spring leaf collection days: **THURSDAY, MAY 8** and **THURSDAY, MAY 22**. All leaves must be in brown, biodegradable, paper bags and placed at the front curb. Thirty-gallon brown paper bags can be purchased at the Borough Office for **\$.50 each**. **Do not put leaves in the street; the leaf vac machine will not be operating at this time!** The fall leaf dates will be in the summer newsletter.

HOLIDAY TRASH/RECYCLING PICK UP SCHEDULE: **Memorial Day**, Monday, May 26: your garbage and recycling collection will be delayed one day to Wednesday, May 28. The **4th of July** will have no affect on garbage or recycling collection.
