




DEFINING BOUNDARIES FOR NATIONAL REGISTER PROPERTIES



WHAT CAN BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE NATIONAL REGISTER?

✦ Buildings

- ◆ principle function is as a shelter for human activity

✦ Structures

- ◆ functional construction that is used for something other than human shelter

✦ Objects

- ◆ things that are primarily artistic in nature and relatively small

WHAT CAN BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE NATIONAL REGISTER?

✦ Site

- ✦ location of a significant event, a prehistoric/historic occupation or activity, or a building or structure (standing, ruined, or vanished) where the location itself possesses historic, cultural, or archaeological value regardless of the value of any existing structure

✦ District

- ✦ possesses a significant concentration, linkage, or continuity of sites, buildings, structures or objects united historically or aesthetically by plan or physical development.

THREE PARTS OF NATIONAL REGISTER ELIGIBILITY

- ✦ In order for a property to be eligible, it:
 - ✦ 1. Must meet at least 1 of the NRHP criteria
 - *detailed in NR Bulletin “How to Apply the National Register Criteria for Evaluation”*
 - ✦ 2. Must have Integrity
 - ✦ 3. Must NOT reflect one of the Criteria Considerations...

NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION

- **Criterion A:**
 - Properties that are associated with one or more events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history.
- **Criterion B:**
 - Properties that are associated with individuals whose specific contributions to history can be identified and documented.

NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION

- **Criterion C:**
 - Properties that embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction, or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction.
- **Criterion D:**
 - Properties that have yielded or may be likely to yield information important in history or prehistory.

HISTORIC INTEGRITY

- ✦ In addition to meeting at least one of the Criteria of Eligibility, properties must have:
- ✦ Integrity: The ability of a property to convey its significance.

SEVEN ASPECTS OF INTEGRITY

- ✦ 1: **Location-** is the place where the building was constructed or event occurred.
- ✦ 2: **Design-** the combination of elements that create the form, plan, space, structure, and style of a property.
- ✦ 3: **Setting-** physical environment: landscape, topography, vegetation, etc.
- ✦ 4: **Materials-** the physical elements that were combined or deposited during a particular period of time and in a particular pattern or configuration to form a historic property.

SEVEN ASPECTS OF INTEGRITY

- ✦ **5: Workmanship-** physical evidence of the crafts of a particular culture or people.
- ✦ **6: Feeling** (of historic places)- a property's expression of the aesthetic or historic sense of a particular period of time.
- ✦ **7: Association-** the direct link between an important historic event or person and property.

NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA CONSIDERATIONS

✦ **A. Religious Property:**

- ✦ not eligible unless primary significance for architecture, artistic distinction, or associated with important events.

✦ **B. Moved Properties:**

- ✦ not eligible unless it is significant primarily for architectural value or it is the surviving property most importantly associated with a historic person or event.

NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA CONSIDERATIONS

- ✦ **C. Birthplaces and Graves:** only eligible if
 - ✦ A. Is associated with a person of outstanding importance in the history of the local area, state, or nation.
 - ✦ B. There is no other place surviving that reflects the person's productive life.
- ✦ **D. Cemeteries:** usually not eligible unless:
 - ✦ A. Graves of people of transcendent importance.
 - ✦ B. Incredible antiquity
 - ✦ C. Distinctive design features
 - ✦ D. Associated with historical events


NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA CONSIDERATIONS

- ✦ **E. Reconstructed Buildings:** are eligible when they are accurately executed in a suitable environment and presented in a dignified manner as part of a restoration master plan and when no other building or structure with the same associations has survived. (All three requirements must be met.)
- ✦ **F. Commemorative Properties: Statues and Monuments.**
 - ◆ Usually not eligible unless they are significant for the architectural, artistic, or other design qualities of its own period in prehistory or history.
 - ◆ Can also acquire significance, and therefore be eligible, after the time of its creation through age, tradition, or symbolic value.

NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA CONSIDERATIONS

- ✦ **G. Properties Less than 50 years old:**
 - ✦ Usually not eligible unless they are exceptionally important.

TYPES OF HISTORIC RESOURCES SURVEYS



RECONNAISSANCE LEVEL SURVEY


- The reconnaissance level survey, or “windshield survey,” is designed as a “basic level of survey that results in the characterization of an area’s general development patterns and the nature of its built resources” (PHMC guidance).

INTENSIVE LEVEL SURVEY

- The intensive level survey is a level of documentation designed to produce sufficient information about a property or resource so that it might be evaluated for its significance according to pre-established criteria (as per PHMC guidance).




